We will also see if we can get Tops to donate reusable shopping bags for this project.

Joanne Acquilano makes embroidered Patriotic Angels for the Chapter to give to our Gold Star Families. She also sells the Angels and may donate some of the proceeds to the Chapter.

A box truck will be rented and used to deliver furniture to Liberty Village in Canandaigua to furnish five apartments for Veterans who will be doing independent living. We have a great deal of furniture currently and can easily accomplish this task. Also at Liberty Village, the Common Rooms are in need of books, magazines, puzzles, and snacks, all of which we currently have at the canteen. Nancy Bardeen will be in charge of overseeing the donations and getting items delivered to Liberty Village.

Letters to the American Legions and VFW's in NYS state went out the beginning of May requesting donations to NY#1. This year, the letters highlighted what we did for the Coast Guard stations in Rochester and Buffalo. A few donations already received from these organizations. Last year, we received \$5,000 from these letters.

The Rochester Coast Guard station invited NY#1 to a picnic on Friday, May 17th. The picnic was a thank you to those who helped during the government shutdown earlier in the year.
