Renew your BSMANY#1 Membership!

We strongly encourage renewing via the NY Chapter 1 website rather than using a paper form or the National Website. Using the NY#1 website is much easier for everyone, more accurate, and more complete. It should take only a few minutes to complete your renewal. Your membership at the National level will then be updated.

You do this by going to our website at Bluestarmothersny1.org and clicking on the Members button. Log on (if you forgot your Password, there is a 'Forgot Password' link). When you see the Members page, push the red 'Renew' Button towards the top of the page.

All of your personal information, as is currently on file, will be displayed so you do not have to re-enter it. However, make changes if you like. Click the 'Next' button on the first page to update, if necessary, the information on your military sons, daughters, or other service members. When that is complete, you must agree to the Oath, and then submit your payment (Members only, not Associates) via credit card or check.

You are now finished, and will be notified when your application is approved.

While everyone should submit their renewal as soon as possible, it is especially critical for Executive Board Members to renew no later than August because of National registration requirements.

Please note that you will probably receive emails from the National Website asking you to renew via National. As already stated above, we much prefer you to renew via the NY#1 website instead.
