Due to Covid, in person chapter meetings were put on hold in December. Our Board now meets by text and our chapter is brought up to date by the recording secretary in emails and USPS mail. We are even able to have the chapter vote on motions by email so we can continue our mission.

We did some housekeeping by going through several boxes of years of documentation on our chapter's history. NY 1's Financial Secretary scanned all of the information to memory cards. Then NY 1's Recording Secretary copied the data from the memory cards to flash drives. This

enables us to save our chapter history with back-up. The chapter financial secretary, will keep the memory cards and the chapter recording secretary will keep the back-up flash drives. This has enabled us to be rid of boxes of paperwork and retain our records in a safe electronic manner.

We make an effort to get Veterans without transportation to grocery stores. We donated all the turkeys and trimmings for the Veterans at Eagle Star, Liberty Village and Cadence Square, as well as the Community Living Center, for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We aided a Veteran with 5 children with food from the canteen supplies.

NY Chapter 1 supplies the Veterans at the Community Living Center with personal products in conjunction with the Senior Chaplain at the VA. We have also supplied some of their new residents with clothing. NY1 was able to supply the Veterans at Cadence Square with brand new Polartec blankets and we have supplied winter coats, boots, scarves, gloves and hats to Veterans in need.

NY1 sent gift bags, trees, and packages to 13 units in Baghdad. We have taken care of a female Veteran and her 2 year old son, who have now moved into Cadence Square, with clothing, food, furniture, and bedding. We gave the Female Veterans and the few Veteran wives, a Valentine's basket, supplied by one of our Mothers, filled with Mary Kay items.

We managed to get a sled for the children of Veterans, who live at Cadence Square, so they could enjoy the snow this winter. We gave Christmas gifts from the Chapter to all the Veterans in Eagle Star, Liberty Village and Cadence Square. One of our Moms works with Toys for Tots and they gave the children in Cadence Square and Liberty Village toys for Christmas.

We gave grocery cards to 69 Veteran families for Christmas. We found people in our community to adopt 38 families in need and supply them with Christmas gifts and a gift card to buy either a ham or a turkey for the holidays. NY Chapter 1 adopted a family of 4 for Christmas.

A nearby military family lost their Father in a helicopter crash in Mendon during a training exercise. Two other single, National Guardsmen also lost their lives in the crash. NY1 made a donation for the married serviceman's family in a fund set up for them. We gave each of the 4 children a Build-a-Bear military teddy dressed in fatigues and a blanket especially made for the children by a chapter member. Our chapter also sent condolences to all three families and the National Guard Unit.



It was a difficult year for us to find a new home for the only Blue Star Canteen in the nation. We are still waiting on a closing date on the house on Foster Street. NY Chapter 1, managed to keep on working on behalf of our Troops, Veterans, and Gold Star Families, the best they could manage during hard times and a worldwide pandemic.

The Big Dipper is an auxiliary, on the national, department, and chapter level of the Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. A portion of department & chapter Big Dipper dues go to the national Big Dipper annually just as a portion of our membership fees go to national. Each year at the national convention, the Big Dipper does a silent auction fundraiser, and then award educational scholarships to our military, veterans, and their families through applications. When the 2020 convention was canceled, Big Dipper lost their fundraising opportunity. They came up with a new fundraiser. They put a notice in the national newsletter asking people to

purchase signature squares for two quilts that will be auctioned off at the next national convention. One guilt has a red, white, and blue theme, while the other has a purple, green, and yellow theme. Members of the Big Dipper will assemble the squares and finish the quilts. They will earn \$20 for each square plus the amount raised when they auction the quilts off. Our CEB felt it important to support the Big Dipper's efforts to offer educational assistance and voted to purchase a red, white, and blue square to represent our chapter. Instead of writing a chapter name on the square, Jean Burlingame crossstitched the chapter name and the date.

Another auxiliary of the Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc., is the Gavel Club.

Membership in the Gavel Club is limited to Past National Presidents (PNPs) and is a tradition that goes back decades. The oldest member is 95 and lives in Michigan. The Gavel Club supports a chosen charity each year by bringing small items to the national convention, wrapped in brown paper, to sell as "parcel post" items at \$2 each. The convention attendees love this sale and the fun of picking one of the packages to discover what they bought. The Gavel Club also has a silent auction at the national

convention banquet. They usually take in around \$300 for the parcel post and \$1500 at the auction. The entire amount contributed is sent to that year's chosen charity. In the past, the Gavel Club has supported Folds of Honor, Scents for Soldiers, and Paws of War. It is tradition that PNPs continue the work they did when national presidents with a project they champion. The Gavel Club helps PNPs continue to carry on the finest traditions of Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. Thanks to Jean Burlingame for this information as a PNP!
