According to Mr. Claude Schmid, Founder of Veterans Last Patrol, approximately 100,000 Veterans go into hospice care each year. Veterans Last Patrol have two annual card campaigns: Cards of Gratitude and Operation Holiday Salute. They seek personalized cards year-round from Patriots who wish to say "Thank You" one more time to a Veteran in hospice. Cards from children and schools are particularly popular; however, they are getting churches and private individuals involved as well.
